Annual Retirement Check-Up

As you wrap up the old year and dive into the new, it's a great time to take a look at the overall health of your retirement.

Talk to Your Family

Have you made plans for your family in case of your absence?

- Do you have a will? Is it up-to-date?
- Do you have a funeral plan?
- Is the beneficiary information up-to-date on your life insurance policies, pension plan, funeral plans, etc.?
- Does your family know about any advance directives, power of attorney or other legal documents you have signed?

Maximize Savings on Health Care

- Are you taking advantage of health savings accounts?
- Are you maximizing rollover benefits?
- Are you regularly reviewing your drug plans for the best coverage/value?
- Do you need supplemental or specialized coverage (cancer, stroke, etc.)?
- Are you or will you become eligible for Medicare?

Manage Your Finances

Retirement usually means being on a fixed income. The more you can reduce your fixed expenses, the more you will have left for variables.

- Retire or consolidate debt as much as possible.
- Pay off or refinance your mortgage if feasible, or consider downsizing.
- Look for other monthly payments you can reduce or eliminate.
- Don't ignore your emergency fund. A good rule of thumb is to have a cash reserve large enough to cover three to six months of household expenses or a large or unexpected expense.
- Take advantage of discounts and perks through memberships, apps and loyalty programs.

President's Message

As ARTA starts the new year, we are saddened by the loss of Donna Morey, ARTA Executive Director, who passed away on January 29, 2026. Donna had worked as executive director since 2014.



I first met Donna 30 years ago when we were both on the AEA Board of Directors. She heard that I was from Paragould and asked me if I knew her brother, Mike, who was pastor of First United Methodist Church in Paragould. And, what a coincidence, I had her twin nephews in my 8th Grade Math class! Every time I saw her or she called me, she asked about Paragould and my grandkids, and I would ask her about her nephews.

I served on the interview committee when Donna was interviewed for the job of ARTA Executive Director. Donna knocked that interview out of the ballpark. We knew that she, above all others, was the right person for the job. Donna's heart was full of love for her family, her students, public education, and teachers both active and retired. She worked tirelessly in support of public education, attending meetings for causes that affect public education, retiree benefits and insurance. Donna was an excellent executive director and we miss her.

The ARTA Board of Directors met on February 12, 2026. Rod Graves, ATRS Deputy Director gave an ATRS update, reporting that the investments had a 9.4% return for the year 2024-2025. He shared that the ATRS website has been updated and encouraged everyone to check it out. You can get a 1099, check on your beneficiary, etc. ATRS is rated in the top 5% of investment companies in the U.S.

Mary Alice and Matt Hughes gave an insurance update regarding the Medicare D Drug Plan. They made a proposal to train ARTA members how to help Medicare-eligible retirees review their Medicare Part D plans. The board accepted the proposal, which you will be hearing more about at the upcoming convention.

Area directors and committee chairs gave brief reports on area activities. The Insurance, Constitution, and Grant Committees are meeting in person or via Zoom in the next month.

Linda Powell gave a staff update. ARTA currently has 11,331 members. Our finances are in good shape. Tammy talked about the upcoming convention, membership, strategic planning, and the status of grant applications.

The Annual ARTA State Convention is set for May 5, 2026 at the Benton Event Center. The cost will be \$30 per ticket. Remember to bring your spending money for the paper bag Auction, the proceeds of which will go to the ARTA Grant Fund. The theme for this year's Convention is ARTA ROCKS!!!

The ARTA board has approved a plan as set forth by the Executive Committee to hire an executive director. Linda Powell was appointed and approved by the board to serve as Interim Executive Director until one is hired.

The former office manager for ARTA wanted to give that part of the job up to transition to covering travel from home and Donna asked if I might be interested in the job. She invited me to come and sit down with Mary Huie to see what the job entailed. When I came in and sat down with Mary, it was pretty obvious that Donna had given her the impression I wanted the job (even though I hadn't exactly said that I did) because the next thing I knew, I was the new office manager for ARTA. I enjoyed working with Donna. There was never a time I felt like I worked for her.

I knew Donna not only through her work with both AEA and ARTA, but as a friend. We met at the University of Central Arkansas when she pledged Sigma Kappa. We played intramural sports together - she was much better than I. She and I went to the same church and Sunday School class. After COVID, she stopped attending services in person but would watch the service with her mother on TV. She would call me every Sunday after watching and we would discuss the service.

Donna Morey dedicated her life to education. As a teacher of Adaptive Physical Education, she saw her students for what they could do, rather than what they couldn't. Known by her students as "Coach Mo", she left a lasting impact not only on her students but on many of their parents.



She carried that passion for education as she served as president of the Arkansas Education Association, where she was a fierce advocate for Arkansas public-education employees, and continued that passion advocating for retirees as the executive director of the Arkansas Retired Teachers Association. Donna was also active with Special Olympics Arkansas as a coach where she poured her heart into building courage and confidence by celebrating every achievement.

Donna was my friend. I miss her greatly.

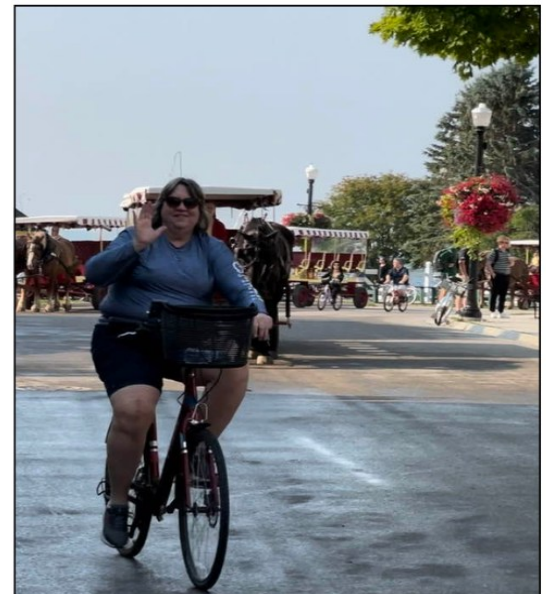
